Sail by one of my favourite authors James Patterson will keep you reading far into the night and surprise you with the way the story ends. A perfect family vacation turns into a life-or-death nightmare. Katherine Dunne hopes this boat trip will bring back the togetherness with her family that was lost when her husband died four years ago. Maybe if her new husband had joined them on this trip all would have been okay. But disaster hits and it's only of the beginning of catastrophe. A good read.

The Last Oracle by James Rollins who wrote The Judas Strain (which was another real page turner) starts with excitement and continues on right to the end. SIGMA Force is sent to battle a group of rogue scientists who've unleashed a bioengineering project that could bring about the extinction of humankind. From ancient Greek temples to glittering mausoleums, from the slums of India to the toxic ruins of Russia, two men must race against time to solve a mystery that dates back to the first famous oracle of history – the Greek Oracle of Delphi. One question remains: Will the past be enough to save the future.

Stolen Innocence by Elissa Wall is her story of growing up in a Polygamous Sect, becoming a teenage bride, and breaking free of Warren Jeffs. September 2007, in a packed courtroom in Utah, sat Elissa, the star witness against polygamous sect leader Warren Jeffs. Her testimony shows the most compelling evidence against Jeffs and shows the harsh realities of this closed community and the lengths to which Jeffs went in order to control the sect's women. This is Elissa's incredible story of how she emerged from the confines of the Fundamentalist Church of Latter Day Saints and helped bring one of America's most notorious criminals to justice.

Up Till Now by William Shatner is an interesting story about the man who played Captain Kirk for years, also T.J. Hooker and most recently in Boston Legal. In this touching and very funny auto-biography, William Shatner reveals the man behind these

unforgettable moments and tells us how he's become the worldwide star and acclaimed actor he is today.

For the many fans of Danielle Steel out there, she has a new novel titled *Rogue*. This is a story of two unforgettable people pursuing happiness from opposite directions; it is a journey of choices and the amazing opportunities that come together – just when life seems to have been successfully rearranged at last.
