Think Twice by Lisa Scottolini – A novel that makes you question the nature of evil: is it born in us or is it bred? With its blistering speed, vivid characters and perplexing moral questions this book is the ultimate thriller.

The Last Surgeon by Michael Palmer – This story pits a flawed doctor against a ruthless psychopath who has made murder his art form.

Never Look Away by Linwood Barclay – A man's life unravels around him when the unthinkable strikes. At an amusement park, David Harwood is glad to be spending quality time with his wife Jan and 4 year old son Ethan. But what begins as a pleasant family outing turns into a nightmare after an inexplicable disappearance. A frantic search only leads to an even more shocking and harrowing turn of events.

True Blue by David Baldacci –Mason "Mace" Perry was a firebrand cop on the D.C. police force until she was kidnapped and framed for a crime. She lost everything – her badge, her career, her freedom – and spent two years in prison. Now she's back on the outside and focused on one mission: to be a cop once more.....A mysterious high-profile homicide in the nation's capital collides with the dark side of national security in this heart-stopping thriller. A good read.

Worst Case by James Patterson and Michael Ledwidge – Detective Michael Bennet works in New York City and is leading the investigation when a son of one of New York's wealthiest families is snatched off the street and held hostage. His parents can't save him, because this kidnapper isn't demanding money....A good read.
