Road Superintendents Monthly Report:

- The Road Department is now on its winter schedule, seven days per week, 4 staff per shift.
- This past month has seen the Road Department sanding the roads on a regular basis.
- The recent windstorms have caused many trees to be blown on to the roadways and the Department has been being proactive in removing potential blow downs.
- Culverts have been cleaned out and opened and the beaver problems seem to be under control.
- Storm drains have been cleaned of sand and leaves.
- The radiator on 2014 Western Star plow truck is once again leaking and will need to be replaced shortly.
- The Road Superintendent advised that Council needs to consider budgeting for winter maintenance of the Providence Bay sidewalks if the proposed repairs and new sidewalks are approved in the 2023 budget.
